

3.	Blessed are the gentle, for they shall inherit the earth. (Be gentle)	
4.	Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. (Seek Christ's righteousness)	
5.	Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. (Be merciful)	
6.	Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. (Be pure in heart)	Matthew
7.	Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. (Be a peacemaker)	5:3 – 12

But Seek First His Kingdom and His Righteousness • Do Not Worry "For this reason I say to you, do not be worried about your life, as to what you will eat or what you will drink; nor for your body, as to what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they? And who of you by being worried can add a single hour to his life? And why are you worried about clothing? Observe how the lilies of the field grow; they do not toil nor do they spin, yet I say to you that not even Solomon in all his glory clothed himself like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the furnace, will He not much more clothe you? You of little faith! Do not worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for clothing?' For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. Therefore if you are presenting your offering at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and present your offering. Make friends quickly with your opponent at law while you are with him on the way, so that your opponent may not hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the officer, and you be thrown into prison. Jesus is telling us that on that Judgement Day, there will be no time to repent or ask for forgiveness. Below is how Jesus describes how quickly those who have previously repented and chosen to followed Him will be taken up into heaven to be protected from God's ensuing wrath.)	• Matthew 24:36

(Put God first for He is sovereign over all and honor Him.) Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. (Acknowledge who is in charge.) Give us this day our daily bread. (Acknowledge that you are entirely dependent on God.) And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. (Ask God to forgive your sins as only He can.) And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil.' (Ask God to take care of you.) For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions." (You cannot ask God to bestow onto you what you are not willing to bestow onto others.)	Matthew 6:5 – 15
64.	Tend My Sheep So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You."
